## Words from Our Pastor

Christmas has always been a time of anticipation. As a child, I could hardly wait for Christmas morning and all the presents that would be under the tree. I'm sure many of you can relate, but I clearly remember waking up at 4:00 or 5:00 A.M. more than once, unable to sleep a second longer. I'd decide it was better to wait in the dark until at least 6:00 A.M. before waking up the whole house—though, honestly, going back to sleep seemed impossible!

As I grew older and our family spread out, that anticipation remained, but for different reasons. The thrill of presents no longer kept me awake; instead, I began to look forward to the time spent together with family. Even now, Christmas is one of those rare occasions when everyone gathers and those moments are truly cherished.

Then, in 2018, I had a new reason to be excited for Christmas. Dawn was pregnant with Declan, and his due date was December 30th. The anticipation was overwhelming—we felt like kids again, eagerly waiting for the day we would finally meet the gift God had given us. Of course, Declan had his own plans and arrived a little later than expected, on January 12th. That season of waiting forever changed how I experience Christmas.

That sense of eager anticipation is at the heart of Christmas. It draws us into the shoes of Mary and Joseph, who waited with hope for the birth of a baby. But not just any baby—this was the Messiah, the Savior of the world! Christmas invites us to enter into that moment, to feel the excitement they must have felt as they awaited the fulfillment of God's promise. And it reminds us that we, too, can encounter God in a real and personal way. He is Immanuel—God with us, and He is the true gift of Christmas.

But this anticipation isn't just meant to remind us of the past; it's also a hope for the future. Just as the people of Mary and Joseph's time awaited the first coming of the Messiah, we, too, wait for Jesus' return. The anticipation of Christmas is a glimpse of the joy that will one day be ours when Christ returns. May it inspire us to await that day with the same eager anticipation as a child waiting for Christmas morning—knowing the gift we're waiting for will be even greater.




### Church-wide Christmas Caroling Sunday December 8 4:00 P.M.
